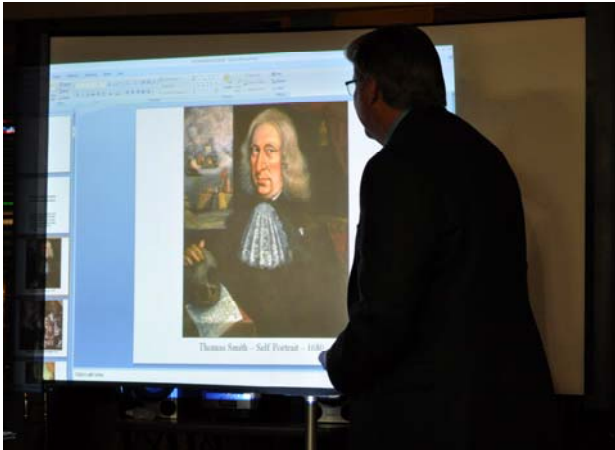
10 men are in process of preparing applications:
