 In cooperation with the Sons of Liberty Chapter several John Collins members participated in the Veterans Day Parade


in Marietta on November 11<sup>th</sup>. Jim Castle and Wayne Brown were a part of the color guard that led the SAR contingent along the parade route.





### Mars Hill Cemetery, John Collins, and Jerry Slate!

The Mars Hill Cemetery Preservation Association has published an alphabetical pdf of all the graves in the cemetery. This includes our Namesake, Capt. John Collins. It also includes Isabella, Felix (1801 to 1873) and Daniel (1813 to 1890). This was quite an undertaking since it also locates every marker by row.

An article was in the Marietta Daily Journal in September concerning the work done.

Our member, Jerry Slate, reports that his distant uncle, William Austin, married John Collins's sister Jane (Jennie) Collins Austin and there are stories of him and her during the revolution, she was quite a young lady and stood in the face of "Bloody Bill Cunningham with a knife when she was 14 years old and he did not kill her.


Jerry relates also that the information he has comes from a book, " The Austin and Allied Families" printed 1936. Jerry has spoken to groups about this and perhaps he can be convinced to tell us more also. The book tells of Jeannie (Jane Collins) riding from Greenville District into North Carolina, her brother, Captain John Collins had come back to recruit, he had gathered 44 recruits and Jeannie with orders from John to find out where to meet up, they sewed the orders in her saddle she went to North Carolina, the General sent back where, when etc. This was just before the battle in Savannah, Kettle Creek and Cowpens. The General was killed at Cowpens and her future husband William Austin was wounded.
