

The Ladies For the SAR Library are ready to take orders for their SAR recipe book, "From Patriotic Kitchens".

The padded, hard cover book will be in a 3-ring binder format, that allows

cooks to add their personal recipes on 5 1/2 x 8" note paper. It will include 700 recipes submitted by compatriots and their wives from all over the country. A four page introduction will discuss the SAR and

the new genealogical library being built in Louisville. Inside 8 full color tabbed dividers will feature patriotic images.

Proceeds from sale of the book will benefit the library fund. The Ladies expect to raise \$250,000.

At \$15, this is a great value. The Ladies will waive the \$2 shipping fee on all orders re-

ceived before January 31, 2002!!

A portion of the purchase price will be tax deductible. An order form has been inserted in your newsletter.

The recipe book will be introduced for the first time at the National Congress in Nashville in June 2002

and pre-ordered books will be shipped at that time. Early orders will help fund the initial printing of the book.

Jack Bledsoe passed away 16 October 2001 at the age of 70. He is survived by his widow Marion Chapman Bledsoe and their four children. Jack reinstated his SAR membership to join the chapter, and was to be our speaker in December. Jack was a member of an incredible number of organizations. He held the SAR record for supplemental ancestors at 63! It is hard to comprehend how one person of Jack's age was fortunate enough to have had 64 ancestors who could be proven to have supported the American Revolution. We are the poorer for his passing.
